Progressives in Kendall County: rare as a snowball during a Texas July, right?

Wrong. There are more of us than you think.

Democrats believe that investments in education, infrastructure and science lead to economic growth and provide everyone with an equal opportunity to succeed. Where you start should not determine where you end up.*

To install political leaders who advance those principles, Progressives must cast off the "my vote doesn' count" inertia and *vote* for such leaders.

Sen. Ted Cruz won his 2012 primary (and therefore his Senate seat) with only 632,000 votes (less than 5 percent of the eligible voting population) in a highly motivated and organized effort.

Our current state leaders are pursuing spurious legal action against DACA, illegally suspending rules for special elections and appointing to a medical task force a person who has faced medical disciplinary action in three states.

Over the past several sessions, the Texas Legislature has significantly reduced the state's funding of public schools even as Texas school populations grow, while giving tax breaks to wealthy corporations (such as a 30 percent reduction in the business margins tax).

Since 2002, a teacher's share of healthcare premiums has more than doubled (the state contribution has remained the same). And Texas ranks last in the US in teacher retirement funding.

Contrast that with the positions of our current Democratic

- Providing adequate funding to public schools, not voucher programs.
- Creating a path to citizenship for hard working people who have lived here as law-abiding citizens for decades.
- Expanding voting rights to all eligible voters and ending

partisan gerrymandering (on either side).

 Supporting sustainable agriculture and the ability of our farmers and ranchers to provide it.

Applying equal rights under the law to everyone.

A motivated and organized Progressive electorate can install new leaders who work from compassion, not greed. And 2018 is our chance. People are energized and ready
